## WINTER REMINDERS

As winter weather sets in, the City would like to remind all residents of a few important ordinances and safety tips to help keep our community safe and accessible for everyone.

#### Sidewalk Snow Removal

City Ordinance requires property owners to clear snow from all sidewalks within 10 daylight hours of a snowfall. If you'll be heading south for the winter, please make arrangements ahead of time to ensure the sidewalk in front of your property is cleared after each snowfall. Keeping sidewalks safe is especially important for pedestrians and senior citizens—let's all do our part to help our neighbors.

#### **Keep Snow Out of the Streets**

Please remember that it is against City Ordinance to blow or shovel snow into the streets. Residents and contractors may be fined for leaving piles of snow in the roadway. These piles can freeze, creating dangerous hazards for motorists. Always move snow onto your own property rather than the street.

#### **Clear Snow from Fire Hydrants**

If a fire hydrant is located in the right-of-way near your property, please take a moment to clear snow away from it. Ensuring hydrants remain accessible helps Fire Department crews respond quickly and safely during emergencies.

## Winter Parking Ban

To help City crews safely clear snow and to ensure emergency vehicles can travel easily, the annual winter parking ban went into effect November 1st. Per City Ordinance, no parking is allowed on any City street between 2:00 AM and 6:00 AM. If you have questions, please contact the Police Department at (517) 647-4111.



### WINTER SPORTS REGISTRATION - Will Open on October 1

The season runs from January through mid-February with one weekday practice and Saturday morning games. - **DK/K BASKETBALL:** Leagues will take place in March. There are two available options: Mondays and Wednesdays OR Tuesdays and Thursdays. Teams will practice and scrimmage each hour-long session. Deadline: Mon, February 2nd Cost: \$45 to \$70 depending on residency

#### **RECDESK RESIDENCY STATUS UPDATE:**

Moving forward, only households within Portland city limits will be considered Residents for registration purposes. Households outside city limits (including Danby and Portland Townships) will be classified as Non-Residents. During registration you'll now select your township/municipality instead of Resident/Non-Resident, so the correct fee is applied.

#### **CEMETERY REMINDERS:**

Families are welcome to place Grave Blankets starting November 1st. Please remember they will need to be removed by April 1st, to allow for spring maintenance. Grave blankets that remain after April 1<sup>st</sup> will be removed and disposed of.

For the safety of visitors and staff, we kindly ask that glass vases, urns, or other glass containers not be used.
